No Marriages entered in the period 1642-5. Memoranda correcting baptism entry of 1773 of William Swan, Sergeant in the 30th Infantry Regiment, who fought at Waterloo, 1852.

### **AT FRONT:**

Memorandum that register was new bound in 1698 and 18 new parchment leaves added.

Memorandum that entries were copied from an old Register on 28<sup>th</sup> October 1598.

Memorandum of Deed of Thomas Dalton dated 20<sup>th</sup> March, 33 Elizabeth (1590/1), granting annuity of 20s. from pasture called “Bodnies” to Trustees, whereof Thomas Amye and John Hamond are the survivors, for the Poor, with the consent of the Parson and the Curate, the heir of Thomas Dalton and so many of the grantees as are present. Upon death of six grantees survivors are to convey to two free men who will convey to them and six other grantees.

Memoranda of Burial of various persons (grantees), 1576 – 1597, 1625-9, including George Fuller, 1591, and Thomas Munell, 1629, Parsons of Hildersham.

Memorandum that John Walker and others, copyholders, were Feoffees of Parsons Close in 1567-8, to which Mr Fuller, Parson of Hildersham, was admitted on news of the death beyond seas of Dr. Haskins, with dates of deaths of John Walker etc 1576 – 1596.

Memorandum of grant by Thomas Dalton, dated 20<sup>th</sup> March 33 Elizabeth (as before, but in more detail)

Memorandum that Thomas Dalton was only a co-feoffee with eight others, and had no right to make such a grant, for the closes called “Bodneyes” were purchased with the town stock for the use of the town and the poor, who should therefore have the benefit of them. Mr George Dalton let it for 40s per annum, so 40s per annum should be paid to the Poor, as

is recorded in Mr Paris' Court Rolls of Hildersham at his Court Baron on 10<sup>th</sup> October 1587, and also on the page before the marriages in this Register.

### BEFORE MARRIAGES:

Copy of Deed, dated 2<sup>nd</sup> August 16 Henry VIII (1524) whereby Philip Paris, Esq., Sir Henry Amy, Vicar, and the inhabitants of Little Abington, Sir William Winter, Vicar, and the inhabitants of Great Abington, and Mr. Thomas Burgoyne, Parson, and the inhabitants of Hildersham gave to John Sampson, Hugh Latimer<sup>1</sup>, William Binder, Thomas Horwood, Thomas Bitson, Christofer Baily, Rowland Swinburne<sup>2</sup>, David Bland, Henry Mallatt, Nicolas Heath and Lancelot Rydley<sup>3</sup> their rights in lands and tenements in both Abingtons, Hildersham and Babraham, which John Abolton gave them to finding of a Priest at Cambridge and the tax of the three towns, in return for which John Samson (sic) etc will find an Honest Priest from the Fellows of Clare Hall in Cambridge to pray daily for the soul of John Abolton, his father, mother and Agnes his wife and William Lambert and Margarett, his wife, and to preach a sermon once a year in Little Abington, and say Dirige and a Requiem Mass, and to pay on the first Sunday in Lent 20s to Churchwardens of both Abingtons and Hildersham, that is 6s 8d each, of which 3s 4d is to be spent upon the church and 3s 4d to be distributed to the Poor. (*Latter partly mutilated*)

Copy of Deed dated May 1576 (*almost all cut away*)

Copy of Entry in Court Roll of the Manor of Hildersham dated October 1587, recording that Alexander Downes, Thomas Dalton, John Amye, John Chambers, John Bentley, John Cottiford, William Hamond and William Martin are co-Feoffees of four acres of land and pasture inclosed, called "Bodneyes" granted by John Walker late of Hildersham by Deed dated November, 16 Elizabeth (1573) on trust to distribute profits yearly with the advice of the Parson or Curate of Hildersham and the Churchwardens at Lady day and Michaelmas to the neediest people of Hildersham. Provisions for conveyance to new feoffees and for audit of accounts.

Memoranda of Baptisms, 1541 – 1591, Marriages 1576 – n.d. and Burials, 1542 – 1609, including Mistress Paris, Lady and Patroness of Hildersham, buried at Great Linton 1542. (*Three pages cut before burials; two pages cut out and two mutilated before marriages; two pages cut out and mutilated at end*)
